One or two interesting reads to include in this newsletter and a "heads up" as they say, about the Spring lunch which will be on Thursday, 25th April.

Firstly a trip down memory lane.

In the 1960's when I was a lad, Dennistoun was awash with cafes and many a summer evening or Sunday afternoon was spent nursing a cola for as long as possible, whilst listening to the juke box or waiting for Alan Freeman with the Top 20 on the radio. The most famous cafes were firstly the Rendezvous at the corner of Sword Street and Duke Street, with Tony Togneri serving the best Macallans in town supervised by his big sister. The Bungalow on Ally Parade had the best juke box, with 45's renewed on a Saturday afternoon and with a brisk business selling on the replaced singles. Then there was the Swallow, the Parade, the Ideal (The Coppola family), the Ally Bar and lastly the Venice Cafe, across the road from the other entrance to Alexandra Park. The Venice was spotlessly run by Guido, who was known to lift ones coke bottle to wipe away the ring made by condensation from the cold bottle base. All of these establishments were favourite haunts and I think are greatly missed.

Mr. Togneri came to Glasgow in 1920 from the village of Barga in Tuscany, Italy. He worked at first in a cafe in Anderston, but some years later he and his cousin set up on their own at the Rendezvous. The cafe had a reputation for its ice-cream which Mr Togneri made himself, getting up at dawn to collect the milk and start work. It was also very popular with courting couples. The Togneris owned the Rendezvous until the 1970s.

This photo is of me and the bagpipers at the Galle Face Hotel Colombo, Sri Lanka, built in 1864 and where Mark Twain, Arthur Conan Doyle and Arthur C Clarke amongst others all stayed. On 2nd November every year they have the mixing of the Xmas cake and the bagpipers lead out the 20 odd cooks carrying the ingredients, and playing Scotland The Brave! The cake weighs 2000kg, including 300kg of cashew nuts, 60 litres of Brandy and Arak and 300kg of flour. A restored car bought by the Duke of Edinburgh for 12 pounds in 1942 is in the lobby of this beautiful hotel.
